As part of the Auxiliary Youth Activities Program, Auxiliary can sponsor a youth group and engage one of the programs, including activities to honor our veterans or assist our service members and their families. Involving youth in your programs can bring new membership to your Auxiliaries – members will feel invested in your Auxiliary thus creating a bright future for Auxiliary, Veterans, and the Community as a whole.

Patriotic Youth Award: The Patriotic Youth Award is designed to recognize individual youth for their patriotism and/or support for veterans, service members and their families. A fillable printable version of the form is available at vfwauxiliary.org/resources – Under Youth Activities.



Illustrating America – What is Illustrating America: This is a patriotic art contest for three divisions: K-2, 3-5 and 6-8. To encourage student's artistic and creative abilities through drawings and paintings. This visual example of art will display the youth's ideas about America and their views. Their ideas will

show through the drawings and paintings. All the winners for each grade division will be displayed at the National Convention.

Getting Excited for the Red, White, and Blue: This is a contest for grades K-12 at the local entry and will be judged on vocal ability, mastery of lyrics, originality or interpretation and entertainment value. The contest consists of two (2) grade divisions: K-8 and 9-12. The Department 1st place winner in each grade division will be forwarded to National Headquarters. There is one National winner in each grade division, with awards for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each grade division. Patriotism through Literacy: Promote and support reading among youth with this simply, fun, and potentially free (use your local library) initiative. Organize with an elementary school the auxiliary reading to the students in their classrooms. Introduce historical figures and events in



our nation's history that will promote a lifetime of learning. Reading has many benefits, including improved grammar and writing skills, focus and concentration.

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Involving Youth in ALL Auxiliary Programs: Youth play such an important role in our future. Encourage involvement from an early age in all your programs. Every young person can find their place to serve when they are presented with a variety of opportunities to serve their communities and veterans. In doing this, you will teach our youth to respect and take pride in our country, appreciate our military, and many other worthy efforts.
